|            | parish; from the provision and maintenance of King George V Playing        |              |

|            | tackling minor highways matters such as reporting potholes etc.; basic     |              |
|            | but essential services that enhance the quality of life for the residents  |              |
|            | of, and visitors to, our parish. The Council is also a statutory planning  |              |
|            | consultee and has looked at and responded to a number of planning          |              |
|            | applications over the past year.   |              |
|            | More significantly there has been new play equipment installed at the      |              |
|            | playing field in the past year. The Parish Council is looking at providing |              |
|            | car parking at the top end of the field and is currently looking at the    |              |
|            | permissions required for this project. An application to Tesco Bags for    |              |
|            | Life has been submitted to facilitate the purchase of a new see-saw        |              |
|            | for the play area and I would ask that you vote for our project at the     |              |

|            | The Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group is working hard in pursuing a        |              |
