Our priorities entering this part of the year will be Drugs, Persistent and Severe Anti-Social Behaviour, and Retail Crime and Shoplifting. You will no doubt have noticed that two of the three priorities have remained the same, as ultimately it is clear that they are incredibly important to our communities. Through speaking with some of you as well as partnership engagement, it is clear that they are necessary to remain and from speaking to our local business owners, Shoplifting is something that needs a renewed focus.

I am not suggesting that Serious Violence is suddenly less important, however due to our increased focus I feel that the attention we show this has become business as usual among our front-line responders, specialist investigators, as well as prevention work delivery. We continuously monitor our Crime Data, as you can too via

our website, and regularly review and adapt our approach where necessary to ensure we remain current and relevant with the needs of our community as a result.

We are also starting to host and increasingly number of renewed engagement events, all of which the details are online so please come and see us if you have any questions or queries and the team will be more than happy to assist you accordingly.

# United against drug crime: South West police join forces to target drug criminality

Last month (30 Sept – 6 Oct), police services across the South West - Avon and Somerset, Devon and Cornwall, Dorset, Gloucestershire, and Wiltshire –together with the South West Regional Organised Crime Unit (SWROCU) - joined forces in a coordinated effort to combat drug-related crime on our roads and in our communities.

The operation focused on disrupting drug markets, dismantling organised crime groups, and safeguarding our communities from the harm associated with drug crime, including serious violence and anti-social behaviour. By sharing intelligence and resources, officers conducted targeted actions such as:

- · Intelligence-led vehicle stops
- · Search warrants at properties suspected of drug activity
- · High-visibility patrols in areas known for drug crime
- · Community engagement events to educate the public about the risks of drug-related crime

Across the week, results included:

- · Intelligence-led vehicle stops
- Search warrants at properties suspected of drug activity
- · High-visibility patrols in areas known for drug crime
- Community engagement events to educate the public about the risks of drug-related crime Across the week, results included:
- $\cdot$  117 arrests for drugs-related offences including possession, supply, trafficking, drug importation and drug driving
- · 19 people charged with offences to date
- The seizure of nearly 400kg of suspected Class A drugs and cannabis, along with a large number of ecstasy pills
- $\cdot\,$  Over £55,000 in cash seized suspected to be linked to drug crime
- 109 education and engagement events with local communities and schools
- · At least 23 adults and children safeguarded after vulnerability checks
- · 6 weapons seized

## Scam calls from fraudsters purporting to be from a bank/ building society

We ask for residents to continue to be vigilant of the scam in which residents are contacted by unexpected telephone calls from bogus callers claiming to be from their bank/fraud department/police, as we have received a number of recent reports in Devon & Cornwall.

The fraudsters claim the victim's bank account has had fraudulent activity, or similar, and they need to urgently transfer their money - if you receive a call like this hang up the call immediately and do not provide any of your bank details.

- Any police, bank or fraud department will never ask for your PIN or to transfer or withdraw money - If you receive a call like this it is a scam, please hang up the call immediately and do not give any information.
- · If you need to contact your bank please wait at least 5-10 minutes for the line to clear before making a call, or clear the line by phoning a friend/family member, or make the call on a different phone to the one you were contacted on.
- If you have already given your bank details over the phone or handed your card details to a courier, call your bank straight away - phone 159 to reach your bank's fraud department directly.

## Bodmin Police Station has been utilising the unique skills of the Neighbourhood Support Team to help combat the supply of drugs.

The team, using a mixture of tactics, have targeted two known individuals in the area.

They attended an address and witnessed the suspect throwing thousands of pounds of cocaine out the window trying to dispose of the evidence.

He was quickly arrested.

His partner was also located and arrested.

After being released from custody, he didn't spend too long before he was back at it.

The Neighbourhood Support team in plain clothes located him in an alleyway breaching his bail conditions.

He was arrested again and this time we thought prison would be a better place for him.

#### **Excellent news - PREMISES CLOSED!**

On Tuesday 22nd October 2024 an application was heard at Bodmin Magistrates Court for a premises closure order in relation to a property in Bodmin that had become a significant source of anti-social behaviour. The order was granted by the court which means that it is now an offence for anyone (other than a representative of the housing association owners / emergency services) to enter. This is in place for 3 months.

We were also successful in securing a partial closure on another property in Bodmin thereby protecting the vulnerable occupants.

This result has come about through excellent community intelligence and partnership working with Cornwall Council Anti-Social Behaviour Team, Devon & Cornwall Police legal team and Cornwall Housing.

Bodmin and Wadebridge Police dealt with a large variety of jobs!

Every day in the Police is different with each incident presenting its own unique challenges.

Just some of the jobs the team dealt with out of the hundreds of reports and calls.

A 13-Year-old smashing up his classroom.

A male arrested for attacking his neighbour ans smashing a window.

A male attempting to deal drugs while drunk. He was searched and arrested!

Two positive stop searches for Drugs resulting in two arrests.

Multiple missing people and children. This ranges from adults with dementia to children running away from school.

Fallen trees on the road causing obstructions.

Sudden deaths (Police officers attend all incidents of sudden or unexpected deaths that occur outside of a hospital or medical setting.)

A few packages containing suspected drugs washing up on our Beaches!

At approximately 0815hrs one morning (15/10/24) we were received a report of a drunk male behaving in an anti-social manner on Fore Street in Bodmin. He was said to be throwing things at other members of public plus shouting racist remarks at some passing school children. If you were subjected to this unacceptable behaviour or witnessed it, we are keen to hear from







