Bodmin Police attended Bodmin college with a Knife Arch as part of OP SCEPTRE.


OP SCEPTRE is a national initiative to tackle knife crime.

Breward on the morning of Thursday 17th April 2025. The trained Police Volunteers used a speed gun to monitor the speeds of the vehicles driving through the village. Details of those vehicles exceeding the speed limit were passed to the Police for formal action to be taken.

The Bodmin and Wadebridge Neighbourhood police team were present for Padstow's May Day celebrations, known as the Obby Oss festival, to help keep people safe, deal with any anti social behaviour and ensure everyone was able to have a good time. This is an annual event featuring two "Obby Oss" (hobby horse) costumes, one blue and one red, which are paraded through the town. The festivities involve processions, dancing, and music, culminating in a grand meeting of the two "Osses" at a maypole.

A good time definitely appeared to be had by all and there were only a couple of minor incidents that the police needed to be involved with.

Due to a series of thefts at the site DCP working together with Suez and DeterTech have installed security equipment at the site.

This includes the 'Dalek', as well as Smartwater over products within the site. The 'Dalek' lights up the area, has CCTV, voice commands and notifies a security company and Police with any intrusion.







Scott and Laura attended the shops that sell knives in Wadebridge and had a discussion with them with reference to knife purchasing and pushing the recommendation of challenge 25. They were all grateful for our attendance and most were already fully aware of the countrywide campaign.

Mercedes stopped and driver found to be an unsupervised and uninsured. He then




